



SECOND NOTICE OF TRUSTEE NOMINATION

It is time for the selection of a Parish Trustee, one of the positions of the Parish as a legal corporation/entity. There are two parish trustees, Christopher Gauthier and Lenny Schaefer, each serving renewable two-year terms. The term of **Lenny Schaefer** is ending this year.

According to Archdiocesan policy on Trustee Nomination:

- Trustees must be parish members, practicing Catholics and at least 25 years of age.
- Bylaws require that trustees be **elected** every two years, by the parishioners, to serve a two-year term. Trustees serve until their successors are elected.
- Parish staff and permanent deacons are not eligible to serve as trustees.
- The archbishop, as president of the corporation, has the right to approve or disapprove any lay trustee elected by the parish or appointed by the pastor to succeed or to fill temporary vacancies or unexpired terms.
- One trustee is designated as the trustee-treasurer and the other as the trustee-secretary.
- Trustees are ex-officio members of the parish council and participate fully in the work of the council.
- Trustees may not hold office on the parish council nor should they serve as chairpersons of parish committees or liaisons to committees.
- At least one trustee (usually the treasurer) along with the pastor must sign each check issued by the parish.
- Parish trustees are not to initiate or respond to any lawsuit in the name of the parish without the written permission of the archbishop.
- The trustee-treasurer is an ex-officio member of the Finance/Administrative Services or Finance Committee.
- Additional candidates must be nominated in writing by 10 or more parish members.
- If there is more than one candidate, an election will occur in June.

With his consent, I am nominating **Lenny Schaefer** to serve as parish trustee for a term of two years. If anyone else is interested, kindly submit a nomination as per the above stated regulations. Nomination forms are available from Lori Gabert at the parish office.

Five reasons Catholics honor Mary in May

In his 1965 encyclical, Mense Maio, Pope Paul VI wrote about the importance of Mary's intercession for all the world, explaining that those who encounter her, encounter her Son, Jesus. The Catholic Church has dedicated May in her honor.

It has been a long-standing Catholic tradition to honor the Blessed Virgin Mary in May.

Although we do not see Mary as a goddess of any sort – Catholics do not worship Mary, we honor, or venerate, her as Jesus' mother – we have adapted the early Greek and Roman customs of honoring important women in their religions by honoring the most important woman in our religion: Mary. Here are five reasons why it makes sense to honor

her this month.

1. Mary is Jesus' mother.

She is the instrument of the Incarnation and her yes, or fiat, made it possible for our Lord to become the God-Man who was crucified for our salvation.

2. She is the first and most perfect disciple. Mary was the first to hear the Good News, and the first to follow Christ. Her entire life was devoted to him and assisting him, in whatever way she could, to

carry on his mission. Unaffected by Original Sin, she was able to perfectly open herself to God's will.

3. She is our mom.

No, really. She is. To put it simply, she's our mother because we are all members of the Body of Christ. Since she gave birth to that Body, then she's our mother, too. At the moment she gave her fiat, she became our mother in the order of grace. She may not have given birth to us physically, but she certainly has given birth to us spiritually.

4. She loves you more than you can ever imagine.

If she did not, would she have endured the horror of seeing her Son tortured, scourged, crowned with thorns, carry the Cross to Calvary, and die a gruesome death on it? She did it for you, for all of us, because she understood that Jesus' Passion and Crucifixion was the only way to your (our) salvation. She loves you like no human mother ever could.

5. Mary is advocate, helper, benefactress and mediatrix.

Her job, so to speak, began at the moment she conceived Jesus in her womb and continues until this day. What is more, it will continue for all eternity. As the first and most perfect disciple, she is devoted to accompanying him and continuing her saving office by interceding for us so that we may receive the gifts of eternal salvation. She is at work 24/7/365/forever,
