

Why is Pentecost called the <u>"birthday of the Church"?</u> It is called the Church's birthday

because on that day the Holy Spirit Birthday! was sent by Christ to sanctify the Church by transmitting the graces Jesus had won through the cross and his resurrection. The Catechism teaches: "On that day, the Holy Trinity is fully revealed. Since that day, the Kingdom [of God] announced by Christ has been open to those who believe in him: In the humility of the flesh and in faith. they already share in the communion of the Holy Trinity. By his coming, which never ceases, the Holy Spirit causes the world to enter into the 'last days,' the time of the Church, the Kingdom already inherited, though not yet consummated. ... The mission of Christ and the Holy Spirit is brought to completion in the Church, which is the Body of Christ and the Temple of the Holy Spirit. This joint mission henceforth brings Christ's faithful to share in his communion with the Father in the Holy Spirit" (731, 737 -738).

#### How should we celebrate Pentecost?



As Christians, we should embrace the words of the Catechism, "Annually, the Church celebrates the memory of the Pentecost events — the beginning of the new 'age of the Church,' when Christ lives and acts in and with his Church" (Glossary, p. 893; cf. 1076). It adds, "The Church's mission is not an addition to that of Christ and the Holy Spirit, but is its sacrament: In her whole being and in all her members, the Church is sent to announce, bear witness, make present and spread the mystery of the communion of the Holy Trinity" (738). As members of the Church, we must each strive to work for the fulfillment of the mission of the Church. We are not alone in this. We have the certain assurance that the Holy Spirit will remain with the Church forever. The Catechism says, "The Holy Spirit, whom Christ the head pours out on his members, builds, animates and sanctifies the Church. She is the sacrament of the Holy Trinity's communion with men" (747).
