

Thank you to the Pallottines and Fr. Tom PC, the choir, the sound operator, the liturgical ministers, the sacristy volunteers and all who attended Mass.



Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time June 16, 2024

EZ 17:22-24; PS 92:2-3, 13-14, 15-16; 2 COR 5:6-10; MK 4:26-34

As we enter back into Ordinary Time, our readings today remind us that



In our First Reading, the prophet Ezekiel foretells the coming of the Kingdom of God. We can see that Jesus is the cedar that will become refuge for all people. He will humble the proud, lift up the lowly and produce good fruit in the weakened. It is God who does the wondrous works.

We often go through life wanting to be in control. We try to solve all our problems, as we think, "I can do it myself." We cling to our own ideas by putting certain events, future plans or even day-to-day moments into a perfect little box, "This is the way I want it." We can even push back in moments of suffering by trying to find every possible way to get out of it. We are "in control."



TIME, TALENT, TREASURE

STEWARDSHIP OF TIME GROWING IN GENEROSITY ROOTED IN FAITH

Our minutes, hours, days weeks, months, and years are only part of

God's generosity. We pray because our faith in that generosity requires a response of our time in prayer. Our faith says that prayer is talking with God daily. That conversation can be praise, petition (self or others), forgiveness, or thanksgiving. That prayer time could be liturgy, adoration, scripture, reflection, spontaneous, memorized or written prayers.

Our belief in a generous God and our need for prayer can expand with time set aside. So be liberal with the **Stewardship of Time**. 1% daily prayer is only 15 minutes: before anyone is up, at the end of the day, while walking, before a task, anytime. Be grounded in your relationship with God by being open to your time with the Lord.

The Amazing Effects of the EUCHARIST

- 1) *Union with Christ:* Reception of Jesus in the Eucharist fuses our being with that of Christ.
- 2) **Destruction of Venial Sin:** The Eucharist destroys venial sin. When we receive the Eucharist, we are united with Charity himself, which burns away the vestiges of our venial sins and leaves us cleansed and ready to begin again.
- 3) **Preservation from mortal sin:** It is as if the Eucharist's power washes away the venial sin in our souls and then covers us with a protective coat which helps us to stay away from serious sin.
- 4) **Personal relationship with Jesus:** It is primarily through the Eucharist that we can truly have an intimate encounter with the Person of Jesus.
- 5) *Gives life:* The Eucharist "preserves, increases, and renews the life of grace received at Baptism" (CCC 1392). In other words, reception of the Eucharist increases the life of grace already present within us.

What do Catholics Believe about the Eucharist?

The Holy Eucharist is the real body and blood of Jesus Christ in substance, even though still unleavened bread and wine in appearance. This is called "transubstantiation."

- ◆ The elements become the body and blood at the moment when the priest says the words, "This is my body" *poof* and "This is my blood."
- They stay the real body and blood as long as they keep their same form.
- ◆ Taking the Eucharist offers forgiveness for minor (venial) sins, but not major (mortal) sins. If you are in a state of mortal sin, you should not take the Eucharist until after you go to confession.
- ◆ Jesus is wholly present in equal amounts whether you have one speck of either the unleavened bread OR the wine or if you have a huge helping of both. Same amount of Jesus.
