Recently I watched a bunch of YouTube videos on how to optimize willpower in the face of weakness. The message was: do not accept your weakness. Crush it. Dominate it. In one video, however, at the end of a rant by a willpower coach, the muscular stoic admitted, "You'll never actually get what you want, no matter how hard you try." Amazingly, he admitted that willpower alone is not sufficient for us weak-willed humans.

What does God want us to do with our weaknesses, if crushing them with willpower won't work? For example, what should I do with my tendency to arrogance and self-isolation? Or my procrastination? Or my intellectual and physical limitations? Or my selfishness?

The counter-intuitive answer is clear in this week's words from St Paul, "I will rather boast most gladly of my weaknesses in order that the power of Christ may dwell in me (2 Cor. 12:9)." Boast of our weaknesses? Paul isn't promoting weak-mindedness or laziness. Rather, he perceives that Jesus loves us not despite our weaknesses but because of them. Boasting of our weakness means claiming human will is not all we have. It means turning to God whenever we feel weak, which—let's face it—is almost all the time. When we do, we learn to love our weaknesses, because it's there that we meet the strength of Christ. This week, I challenge us to find ways to boast not in willpower but in weakness. — *Father John Muir* ©LPi

#### Mission Weekend is Next Weekend: July 14

Congregation of the Sisters of Our Lady of Usambara Tanga - Tanzania









The Sisters of Our Lady of Usambara is a growing congregation of over 600 African nuns, whose work is caring for the poor and most deprived people in the northeastern region of Tanzania. Rt. Rev. Bishop Eugen Arthurs, I. C. founded the congregation in collaboration with Precious Blood Sisters, CPS to address the needs of the local church within the diocese. To date, the Sisters have expanded services outside of the diocese. The area of ministries includes but not limited teaching religious education to young people, providing services to the poor and the sick, and providing education in schools and colleges.

Also, the Sisters provide food and shelter to the poor and needy people and run orphanages for helpless children who have lost their parent to malaria endemic, HIV/AIDs and other killer diseases. Provide care to malnourished children and medical services to people.

The present of malaria endemic and other killer diseases leads to high demand of medication and medical needs which leads to shortage of or no medication. Very poor medical equipment's is a serious problem. in our area leading to unnecessary deaths. Our community has health centers where children, elderly and others can access medical treatment and education/seminars.

Water is an essential requirement for life, we all need water to survive. In most of our ministry the shortage/no water is a serious problem. In some of our schools' students go for days without water, forcing them to walk for miles to collect water.

The sisters run kindergarten through high schools, two years catechetical and theological training. And a Montessori training college to prepare teachers to teach in low level classes in our education system.

Great demand for food, clothing and shelter. People seeking for food have become our daily guests. Being the local congregation with local nuns as members, the Sisters understand difficulties, problems and opportunities within the community we serve. The problem is shortage of resources to serve people. Your generous support will highly be appreciated. Be assured of our daily prayers. # Archdiocese (Archeparchy) of Asmara, Eritrea

The Archdiocese of Asmara, Eritrea runs the Intereparchial Major Seminary for four dioceses in Eritrea: Archdiocese of Asmara, Diocese of Barentu, Diocese of Keren and Diocese of Segaeneiti.

There are approximately sixty seminarians studying in the major seminary preparing for priesthood. Funds raised through mission appeals will benefit seminarians in their intellectual, spiritual and human development process of formation.

The Eritrean government throws many obstacles for seminarians to respond to their priestly vocation, so the support from mission appeals helps seminarians to follow their call to serve the church under low-intensity persecution.

# Growing in Generosity Rooted in Faith

Talents are only experienced if you try and then practice them. Realizing our experiences of life are influenced by our faith in a generous God, they grow into talents. Smiling, listening, talking, sharing, walking, making, writing, thinking, working, and praying are just a tiny portion of talents that have accumulated. And yes, God has been generous with many life experiences that produce many talents. Discipleship (Volunteering ourselves) becomes another prayer in your life as well.

Try and practice being a part of a liturgical ministry and committees because that helps our worship and parishes to be complete. Because you are generous, so will you experience the generosity of God through worship and others. Say yes and engage because of your God-given generous self.



#### From the Earth Ministry:

#### **Shopping Guide for "Dirty" and "Clean" Produce**

The USDA and FDA annually test 35,200 samples for traces of toxic residue, taken from the 47 most popular fruits and vegetables. In 2022 they found that 70% of the **non-organic**, conventionally-produced samples sold in the US contain residue from potentially harmful chemicals and pesticides.



The worst of these comprise the "Dirty Dozen," whereas the best comprise the "Clean 15."

The Dirty Dozen (listed from most residue to least) were found to be: 1 Strawberries; 2 Spinach; 3 Kale, and collard and mustard greens; 4 Nectarines; 5 Apples; 6 Grapes; 7 Bell and hot peppers; 8 Cherries; 9 Peaches; 10 Pears; 11 Celery; 12 Tomatoes.

The Clean Fifteen (listed from none or minimal residue to only a little) are: 1 Avocados; 2 Sweet Corn; 3 Pineapple; 4 Onions; 5 Papaya; 6 Sweet Peas (Frozen); 7 Asparagus; 8; Honeydew Melon; 9 Kiwi; 10 Cabbage; 11 Mushrooms; 12 Cantaloupe; 13 Mangoes; 14 Watermelon; 15 Sweet Potatoes

Our Earth Ministry encourages you to take these lists with you while grocery shopping, and to **buy organic whenever you can**. As we enter "peak season," most of the produce locally grown at farmer's markets likely qualify as organic. You can always ask the growers to make sure. Regardless, remember to wash ALL produce when you come home from the market or store!

#### **Friendly Phone Callers**

We are looking for volunteers for the Friendly Phone Call program. The Friendly Phone Call Program is a minimum 12 week commitment that involves making calls to our seniors with the purpose of decreasing isolation.

- Volunteers call clients once per week and fill out an online survey for each call or attempted call. The surveys help assess client needs and keep this program funded.
- Most calls last around 20 minutes but whatever you and the client are comfortable with is fine.
- Calls can be made any time it is convenient for both you and the client, usually between the hours of 10:00AM and 7:00PM.
