The world is filled with people whose basic needs aren't met, whether for clean water, nutrition, safety, education, meaningful work, stable family life, basic medical resources, religious freedom, and the right to life. So how can we possibly believe what Psalm 145 says to us this week, "The hand of the Lord feeds us, he answers all our needs"? Does he? What about the countless poor? Can't we identify at least a few unmet needs in our own lives right now? Is the Bible promoting wishful thinking and laziness in helping others?

No. The psalm flows from Israel's experience of God's relentless fidelity again and again—especially in the Passover from Egypt. This divine providence is recalled when Jesus feeds the needy multitudes in the Gospel of John. Passover arrives once again, and the people are hungry like the ancient Israelites on the wilderness journey. What is new is that in Jesus God not only provides for their needs, but He learns what it's like to have those human needs. He shares them too. He feeds them bread and fish; and even more, He hungers to provide them, and us, much more than just that kind of perishable food.

Our deepest need is for God. Like the multiplied bread, all earthly provisions ultimately fail, for we all finally die. Of course, our obligation to meet the needs of the poor is basic. But Christ promises to feed us with the one bread that never fails: God Himself. He is humanity's eternal food. If we eat this bread, we taste the faithfulness of God who answers all our needs, even when every earthly thing fails. — *Father John Muir* ©LPi



World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly

Today we celebrate the Fourth Annual World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly. Pope Francis has established this celebration on the fourth Sunday of July, near the liturgical memorial of Saints Joachim and Anne, the grandparents of Jesus.

The theme for this year's celebration is a line from Psalm 71 – "Do not cast me off in my old age."

This choice was "meant to call attention to the fact that, sadly, loneliness is the bitter lot in life of many elderly persons, so often the victims of the throwaway culture."

The Holy Father said he instituted the World Day of Grandparents and the Elderly because "grandparents are often forgotten, and we forget this wealth of preserving roots and passing on" what the elderly have received. He emphasized the importance of grandparents and grandchildren getting to know one another, because "as the prophet Joel says, grandparents seeing their grandchildren dream," while "young people, drawing strength from their grandparents, will go forward and prophesy."

We will bless all Grandparents and Elderly members of our parishes at all Masses this weekend to honor their contributions to their families and our parish family. Check your Parish website to read the letter written by Pope Francis as he honors these very important people in our lives.

Monthly Maintenance Collection

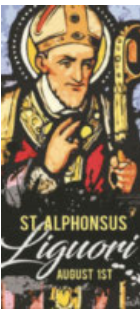

St. Alphonsus Liguori | August 1

Saint Alphonsus was born into a well-respected family in 1696, in Marianella, in the Kingdom of Naples. He received an exceptional education through private tutors and was conferred degrees in civil and canon law at 16. He practiced law for 8 years before he turned to the Church. He was ordained a priest in 1726.

Saint Alphonsus traveled for 26 years in the Kingdom of Naples preaching. His style of ministry was called "mission among the people," he and a group of priests or lay brothers would go to rural areas, staying for a time to teach, preach, and pray with the people there.

Saint Alphonsus was a brilliant preacher, he was able to connect with ordinary people and his teaching and sermons were marked by his compassion. In a time of restrictive Church rule, where fear of God was truly fear, Saint Alphonsus taught about God's redeeming love. He also had a special devotion to Mary, praying to her for intercession and including devotions to her in his teaching. He wrote extensively, more than 100 books which have been through thousands of editions. His books are still available today and have been translated into more than 60 languages.

In 1762 Saint Alphonsus was made a bishop by Pope Clement XIII, however, he was eventually allowed to resign his post because of his ill health. He was paralyzed for a time from rheumatic fever in 1775, and had rheumatism so severe it was deforming, bending his head so far forward that his chin rested on his chest.

He died peacefully at the age of 90 in 1787. He was canonized in 1839 by Pope Gregory XVI, and in 1871 he was named a doctor of the church by Pope Pius IX. In 1950 he was declared patron of moral theologians by Pope Pius XII.

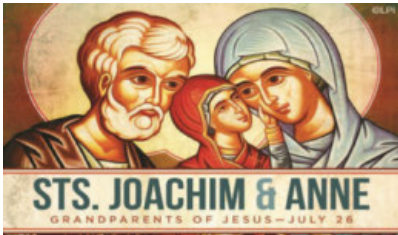

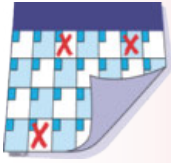

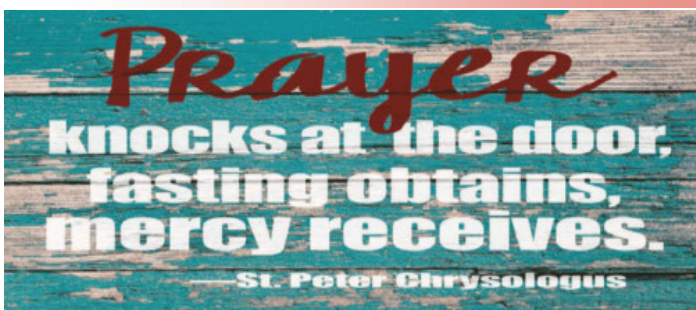

From the Earth Ministry:

Disposal in Wisconsin landfills of electronics -- predominately TV's, cell phones, CD / DVD players, computers and peripherals – has been illegal since 2010.



Of the estimated 25.2 million electronic devices in Wisconsin, 7.6 million are not in use. This suggests that properly disposing of these unused items poses a dilemma, at least, or simply human procrastination at best. Otherwise so many of them would not be sitting around taking up space in our homes, garages, basements or business storerooms.

Electronics contain hazardous materials like lead and mercury as well as valuable metals including gold, silver, copper, palladium and steel. Ninety percent (90%) of the useful materials in electronics can be reclaimed by commercial recyclers.

Electronics recycling in Wisconsin is managed by the DNR's E-cycle Program. Since formation in 2010, 370 million pounds of electronics have been "e-cycled". The steel alone reclaimed is enough to make 22,000 cars. For every million cellphones recycled, 35,000 pounds of copper, 772 pounds of silver, 75 pounds of gold, and 33 pounds of palladium are reclaimed.

The DNR's E-cycle website keeps a current list of community electronics recycling events and other drop-off sites for electronics in every Wisconsin County. For more information, go to dnr.wisconsin.gov/topics/Ecycle.

Friendly Phone Callers

We are looking for volunteers for the Friendly Phone Call Program. The Friendly Phone Call Program is a minimum 12 week commitment that involves making calls to our seniors with the purpose of decreasing isolation.

- Volunteers call clients once per week and fill out an online survey for each call or attempted call. The surveys help assess client needs and keep this program funded.
- Most calls last around 20 minutes but whatever you and the client are comfortable with is fine.
- Calls can be made any time it is convenient for both you and the client, usually between the hours of 10:00AM and 7:00PM.

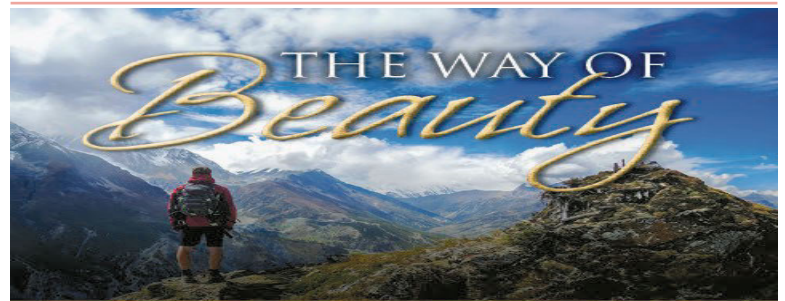


Growing in Generosity
