The famous Russian novelist Fyodor Dostoyevsky said, "Love in action is a harsh and dreadful thing." In the Gospel reading this week, Jesus does something harsh and dreadful — he watches his own disciples abandon him. What could possibly be loving about that?

Well, we notice the context is Jesus' teaching about eating and drinking his body and blood. His followers hear this and

say, "This teaching is difficult; who can accept it?" (John 6:60). We shouldn't imagine we'd do anything different, because not even the ones who stay, like Peter, seem to understand what Jesus is saying. Then we hear this devastating line, "Because of this many of his disciples turned back and no longer went about with him" (John 6:66). Besides the night of the Last Supper, only now do Jesus' disciples abandon him. And, painfully, Jesus just lets them go.

The best way to make sense out of this is love. Jesus is God's love in action. He wants to become one with those whom He loves. He wants to love them as His own body. Yes, the oneness manifested in the Eucharist sounds harsh and dreadful because it is rooted in love which is willing to risk abandonment and separation to attain its goal: to be one body with the beloved. It is both terrifying and wonderful that Jesus will risk losing us in order to be one with us. Our response? Lord, we cannot grasp a love so great, but please help us never to abandon it, either. — Father John Muir ©LPi

What's Next?

Year 3 of the Eucharistic Revival

The Eucharist Congress in Indianapolis, IN concluded year two of the nation-wide Eucharistic Revival. You may be asking "What's Next?" as we move into year three. If you are asking that question, you are in good company. Even the followers of Jesus asked that question of themselves: "How can this man give us his flesh to eat?" Jesus replied:

Just as the living Father sent me and I have life because of the Father, so also the one who feeds on me will have life because of me. This is the bread that came down from heaven... (John 6: 57)

Dr. Mary Healy, in answering that question during her presentation on Emmaus 90, put it this way:

The Eucharistic Missionary has been so moved and transformed by the love of God that he cannot keep it to himself ... he/she has to share it with others, both in words and deeds, to make that divine love available to others.

Instead of asking "What's Next?" ask yourself "Why do I come to mass?" Does receiving the Eucharist so move me that I cannot keep it to myself, that I have to share with others the divine love that I received in the Eucharist?

A Note From St. Vincent de Paul

In today's Gospel, Jesus asks "Do you also want to leave?" We must ask ourselves if we really want to hear the good news of his love for us and for others. Is the word of God able to break into our consciousness, change us and call us to hear the cries of the poor? 

St. Bartholomew

Feast Day: August 24 Canonized: Pre-Congregation Do you have a good friend who truly knows and loves

one



Twelve apostles, discovered that Jesus knew him even before they had met for the first time.

The Apostle Philip brought Bartholomew, who is also called Nathanael in the Gospels, to Jesus, telling him that Jesus was the person the prophets spoke about, the promised one of God. The moment Jesus saw Bartholomew he praised him, saying that He could see that there was no dishonesty in his heart. Bartholomew immediately began to believe in Jesus. Jesus Bartholomew That He would see great things because of his faith.

Jesus' words certainly came true. Bartholomew did see and hear many great things as an apostle of Christ. He saw Jesus heal the sick and perform other signs to show people God's love. He heard Jesus talk about the Kingdom of God that was open to everyone who lived with love. He saw Jesus suffer and die on the cross to save all people from sin, and he saw the Risen Lord, who told His disciples that they too, could live forever if they followed Him and His teachings.

After receiving the Holy Spirit on Pentecost, Bartholomew traveled to foreign lands to share the Good News about Jesus with others. He founded Christian communities in parts of India and the countries we now call Armenia and Turkey. Although he always spoke the truth about Jesus, some people did not believe him, and he died as a martyr.


