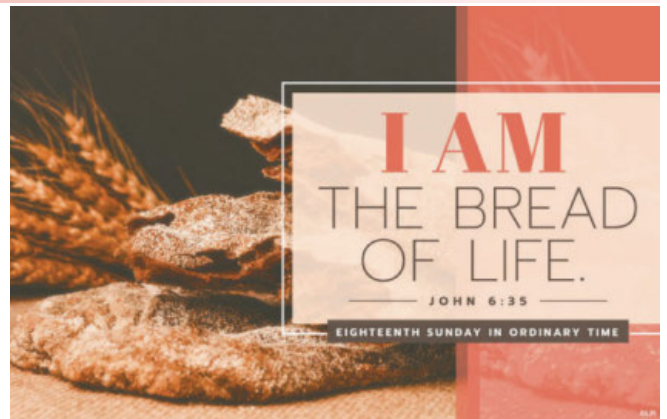

Since my college days I’ve loved a song called “Dance with You” by the rock band Live. It touches on the deep mystical hunger of our heart: “I’ve tasted all the wines/ a half a billion times/ came sickened to your shore/ you showed me what this life is for.” These lines resonate with anyone who has feasted on the good things of this world only to be left spiritually hungover and unsatisfied.

We see a similar dynamic evoked by Jesus’ words after he feeds the crowd with bread and fish. To teach them to hunger for God, he recalls God’s gift of manna-bread for the hungry ancient Israelites. Those folks had grown spiritually sick from the idolatrous food of Egypt yet still longed for more worthless pagan food. So, God sent heavenly bread to nourish their bodies, but also to heal their distrustful hearts. His people — like us — must learn to hunger and thirst for God alone. Before we can receive that which will not disappoint, we first must cease expecting that earthly goods will satisfy us.

We will get to the Lord’s teaching on the Eucharist in the next two weeks. But first, he asks us: do you trust me to take care of you? Do you trust me to give you what you need for each day, and to not worry about the next day? Do you see that when you hungrily stuff yourself with the things of this world you become sick and lose your taste for the bread of life? So, our hungry hearts cry out: Lord, help us to trust that you’ll provide for our every need. Help us to use only what we truly need. Help us hunger for the goodness of your Son, who is the true bread from heaven. That is what this life is for. — *Father John Muir* ©LPi

What’s Next:

Year 3 of the Eucharistic Revival

Before ascending into heaven, Jesus commissioned the disciples with these words:

All power in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age. (Matthew 29: 18-20)

As baptized disciples, that commission also applies to us. How do we do that today in our communities. It’s not just about preaching or talking. It’s what we live ... preaching Jesus by living like Christ. That’s what year 3 of the Eucharistic Revival is all about. And Jesus promises to be with us always. That promise is fulfilled most intimately in the Eucharist.

What can I do today, in my own community, to live more like Jesus?

Did You Know???

Liturgical Colors of Vestments and Meanings

As might be expected, each of the vestment colors has its own meaning. The Holy Eucharistic – Mass is offered for many purposes and in honor of many classes of Saints; these various purposes are all designed and symbolized by the color of the Vestments which the Church prescribes for each Mass.

White

When the Church wishes to denote Purity, Innocence or Glory, she uses White; that is, on the Feasts of Our Lord and of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the festivals of the Holy Angels and of those Saints who were not Martyrs.

Red

Red is the color of fire and of blood; it is used in Masses of the Holy Spirit, such as on Pentecost, to remind us of the tongues of fire and on the Feasts of those Saints who shed their blood for the Faith. (Martyrs)

Green

The color Green is used from the Octave of the Epiphany to Septuagesima, and from the Octave of Pentecost to the 1st Sunday of Advent, except on Ember Days and Vigils during that time, and on Sundays occurring within an Octave.

Purple-Violet

The use of purple or Violet is used from the 1st Sunday of Advent and from Septuagesima to Easter, on Vigils that are Fast days, and on Ember days, except the Vigil of Pentecost and the Ember days during the Octave of Pentecost.

Purple/Violet is also used for Mass on Rogation days, for Votive Masses of the Passion and of Penitential character, at the blessing of candles and of holy water.

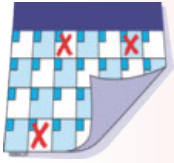
The Stole used in the administration of Penance and of Unction and in the first part of the Baptismal rite is to be Purple/Violet.

Black

Black Vestments have traditionally been worn at all Requiem Masses including All Souls' Day; at the Good Friday Liturgy up to but not including the Communion service. Since the early 1970's the use of White has been allowed for Funerals. Traditionally White was also the use for Funerals of children under the age of 6-8 years.

Rose Colored Vestments

Rose colored Vestments are permitted on the third Sunday of Advent and the fourth Sunday of Lent.

From the Earth Ministry:

Disposal in Wisconsin landfills of electronics -- predominately TV's, cell phones, CD / DVD players, computers and peripherals – has been illegal since 2010.



Of the estimated 25.2 million electronic devices in Wisconsin, 7.6 million are not in use. This suggests that properly disposing of these unused items poses a dilemma, at least, or simply human procrastination at best. Otherwise so many of them would not be sitting around taking up space in our homes, garages, basements or business storerooms.

Electronics contain hazardous materials like lead and mercury as well as valuable metals including gold, silver, copper, palladium and steel. Ninety percent (90%) of the useful materials in electronics can be reclaimed by commercial recyclers.

Electronics recycling in Wisconsin is managed by the DNR's E-cycle Program. Since formation in 2010, 370 million pounds of electronics have been "e-cycled". The steel alone reclaimed is enough to make 22,000 cars. For every million cellphones recycled, 35,000 pounds of copper, 772 pounds of silver, 75 pounds of gold, and 33 pounds of palladium are reclaimed.

The DNR's E-cycle website keeps a current list of community electronics recycling events and other drop-off sites for electronics in every Wisconsin County. For more information, go to dnr.wisconsin.gov/topics/Ecycle.

Friendly Phone Callers

We are looking for volunteers for the Friendly Phone Call Program. The Friendly Phone Call Program is a minimum 12 week commitment that involves making calls to our seniors with the purpose of decreasing isolation.

- Volunteers call clients once per week and fill out an online survey for each call or attempted call. The surveys help assess client needs and keep this program funded.
- Most calls last around 20 minutes but whatever you and the client are comfortable with is fine.
- Calls can be made any time it is convenient for both you and the client, usually between the hours of 10:00AM and 7:00PM.

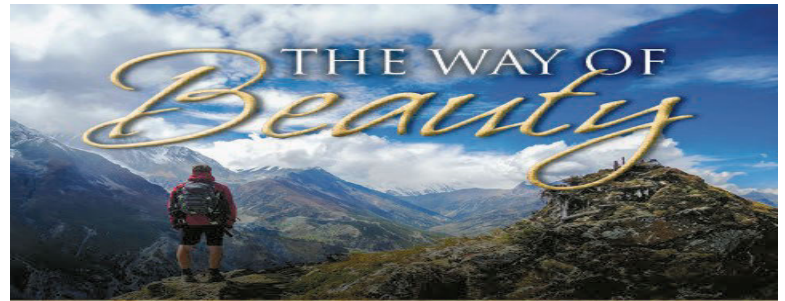
