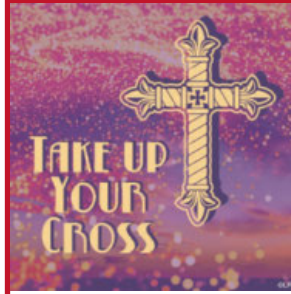

This morning I received a text message that a member of my extended family will likely die of cancer within the next few hours. His name is Luke. He is a 45-year-old husband and father of six. Though I am not as close to him as my sister (she is his sister-in-law and knows him well), I wonder: how can we, including Luke himself, manage such a terribly awful and unfair situation?

The words of this Sunday’s Gospel offer a powerful and challenging path. Jesus says, **“If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me”** (Mark 8:34). Today I see with new freshness the starkness and strangeness of the words *take up*. The cross stands for suffering which is unjust, absurd, seemingly hopeless, and humiliating. Jesus doesn’t say “accept” or “endure” or “tolerate,” but “take up.” Embrace it, actively. Choose it and lift it up for others to see what terrifies and sickens us. But somehow, for Jesus, this is the path to **“saving one’s life.”** A new world is breaking in, one in which love is everything, when no relationship can be wounded or die. I trust that in the embraced suffering of Luke and his loved ones, Jesus is taking up his cross and saving us all.

By the time you read this, barring a miracle, Luke will have died. He will be carrying his cross no longer. But we all still face suffering. This week let’s not just endure, but take up our crosses, big and small. That’s our only hope for saving our lives. — *Father John Muir* ©LPi

Year 3 of the Eucharistic Revival

Year 3 of the Eucharistic Revival is a year of action. We are call to go forth and to proclaim the Gospel to others. But what does this mean? In the Gospel of Mark, which we have been reading on Sundays for the last couple of months, we hear this:

Jesus summoned the crowd with his disciples and said to them, “Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me. For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake and the sake of the gospel will save it.” *Mark 8: 34-35*

I wonder what I would have thought if I had been in the crowd listening to Jesus say those words. The words seem contradictory ... even in the same sentence.

St Therese Reuniting Us As “One Nation, Under God” Prayer Service

This is the third weekend of the month and we ask you to join us for our monthly Prayer Service in the Chapel after Mass. The service is about 25 minutes, and we look forward to you joining us. We say the Rosary and ask Blessed Mary to ask the Lord for His help in reuniting us as “...One Nation, Under God...” with Love and Respect for all as we try to find our way out of the wilderness. We also do a short meditation to help us prepare for the week ahead! Please join us in prayer to gain back our “...One Nation, Under God...” again!

Cross Bearers Needed

We have begun to add more ritual to our Masses at St. Therese. The processions at the beginning and end of Mass are now led by a cross bearer. This ministry role has just been added to the on-line sign up. You can also sign up by calling the parish office. Below is what the ministry requires:

- Take the cross from the altar, with confidence, and bow toward the altar before you go up the steps. Go with the cross to the sacristy 10 minutes before Mass. Join the other ministers in prayer and go with them to the chosen aisle.
- Lead the procession to the altar.
- When you reach the base of the altar, you may stay in the middle or slightly left. Wait until everyone arrives and is arrayed at the foot of the altar. Then, when the lector begins to put the Gospel book on the altar and the servers are placing the candles at the altar, you will place the cross onto the base, being sure that the cross then faces the congregation. When you have placed the cross, you return to the foot of the altar. Then you may return to your seat for Mass.
- For the recessional, go to the altar, bow toward the altar then go up the steps. When the last song begins, take the cross from the stand and wait with it there until Father begins to leave the altar. Then go to the base of the altar, facing the altar and await Father’s indication that the recession will begin. Begin to walk slowly in the direction of the exit aisle (determined by Father before Mass begins) and everyone will follow.
- After Mass, return the cross to the base on the altar.

Did You Know???

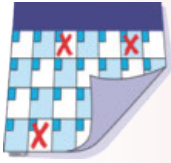
St. Joseph of Cupertino Feast Day: September 18

St. Joseph was born in 1603 at Cupertino, in the diocese of Nardo in the Kingdom of Naples. It is said that his mother often considered him a nuisance and treated him harshly. Joseph was purported to be slow to learn and absent-minded. He was said to frequently wander aimlessly, with his mouth gaping open. And, he had a bad temper, so, he was not at all popular. He tried to learn the trade of shoemaking, but failed. He asked to become a Franciscan, but they initially would not accept him. Finally, he did join the Capuchins. However, for a very short period of time. Eight months later, they sent him away. Sources say it was because he could not seem to do anything right.

He dropped piles of dishes and kept forgetting to do what he was told. His mother was not at all pleased to have the eighteen-year-old Joseph back home again, so she finally got him accepted as a servant at the Franciscan monastery. He was given the friars habit and put to hard work taking care of the horses.

About this time, Joseph began to change. He grew in humility and gentleness, fruits of the Holy Spirit at work in a person. He became more careful and successful at his work. He also began to pray more do more voluntary acts of penance. Finally, he was able to enter the Franciscan order and, eventually, study for the priesthood. Although he was a good and holy friar, he had a very hard time with studies. During his seminary exams, the examiner happened to ask him to explain the only thing he knew well, and so he was ordained a deacon, and later a priest.

After this, the Holy Spirit began to work many amazing miracles through St. Joseph. Over seventy times, people say they saw him rise from the ground while offering Mass or praying. Often, he went into ecstasy and would be caught up in talking with God. He fell so deeply in love with God that everything he saw only drew him into a deeper union. He said that all the troubles of this world were nothing but the "play" battles children have with popguns. St. Joseph became so famous for the miracles that he was finally kept hidden from the public, but he was happy for the chance to be alone with his beloved Lord. On His part, Jesus never left him alone and one day came to bring him to Heaven. Pope Clement XIII canonized him in 1767. He is the patron saint of air travelers, pilots and learning disabled.

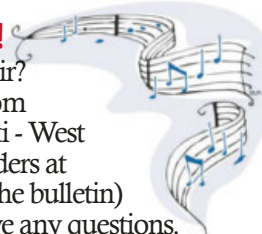


Annual Pet Blessing

From The Earth Ministry:



Honey Creek Parkway bisects Bluemound Rd between St Therese and Saint Vincent Pallotti Parishes. Over the past few years, a group of Tosa and Milwaukee volunteers have been working to remove the many overgrown, invasive plants and trees (primarily buckthorn), in order to restore the Parkway's natural flora and fauna.

The Friends of Honey Creek (FOHC) is organized under the umbrella of the Park People, www.Parkpeoplemke.org. Volunteers coordinate their restorative work with Milwaukee County Park's workers, naturalists, and arborists. They work on Tuesday mornings each week during the summer and on different evenings in the fall once school starts. The group provides gloves, tools and other items for volunteer workers.
