One of the most touching YouTube videos I've ever seen is one in which a deaf woman receives new technology to heal her hearing. She hears her husband's voice for the first time — and her own, too — and bursts into tears of overwhelming joy. It must have been like an immovable wall between her and her loved ones came tumbling down.

We are all like this woman, to some degree. We believe in the presence of God's love, but we can't hear Him. We can't speak well about Him. The deaf man who can't speak properly in the Gospel today is an image of what God wants us to experience again and again. Jesus takes the man aside to a private place away from the crowd, touches his ears and tongue, and says, "Ephphata!" The man's ears are opened, and he speaks clearly. Contact with Christ has this effect on us.

This experience happens to us in our baptism, almost exactly. It happens to us in the liturgy. It happens in our private prayer. It happens when we hear the voice of God in our conscience. The more we engage these privileged channels of Jesus' healing, the more we are empowered to hear and speak of the presence of God's perfect love. — Father John Muir ©LP



From Communion to Community

Year 3 of the Eucharistic Revival

We hear in the gospel that after Jesus cured a deaf man who had a speech impediment, he ordered his followers not to tell anyone.

But the more he ordered them not to, the more they proclaimed it. They were exceedingly astonished and they said, "He has done all things well. He makes the deaf hear and the mute speak." (Mark 7:36-37).

If we are attentive and mindful of what tales place when we receive Jesus in the Eucharist, we too are "exceedingly astonished" and cannot keep from telling others that Jesus does all things well.

In week 5 of Emmaus 90 Michael Gutzwiller reminded us that, as disciples of Jesus, we are commissioned to do more than just tell others about Jesus. Rather, Jesus calls us to be missionaries. It is our encounter with Jesus in the Eucharist that inspires and necessitates us to go out and fulfill the commission of Jesus and share the love of Christ with others.

What is one intentional and concrete way that I can fulfill the commission of Jesus and share Christ's love with someone in need this week? Suggestion: Use the "corporal works of mercy" as a guide.

A Note From St. Vincent de Paul

In today's Gospel we hear how Jesus "makes the deaf hear and the mute speak!" In living the gospel, we must open our ears to hear and recognize all the everyday opportunities for making God's presence known especially to those who are poor and suffering. On September 9, the Church also celebrates the feast of Blessed Frederic Ozanam, the founder of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul. Frederic heard the call of Jesus to love and serve those who are suffering. Is there a family you know who needs assistance? Please call the Society of St. Vincent de Paul so that together we can "make God's presence known" to those who are suffering and poor.

St Therese Reuniting Us As "One Nation, Under God" Prayer Service

Please join us for our monthly "One Nation, Under God" Prayer Service after Mass on September 15. The service is about 25 minutes. We say the Rosary and ask Blessed Mary to intervene for us with the Lord in seeking His help to reunite us as "One Nation, Under God" as we seem to be lost in the wilderness and have forgotten our love of God and one another. We need His help to find our way. We also do a short meditation to remind us that while we are all different, we need to Love One Another!

Cross Bearers Needed

We have begun to add more ritual to our Masses at St. Therese. The processions at the beginning and end of Mass are now led by a cross bearer. This ministry role has just been added to the online sign up. You can also sign up by calling the parish office. Below is what the ministry requires:

- Taking the cross from the altar, with confidence, and bowing toward the altar before you go up the steps. Go with the cross to the sacristy 10 minutes before Mass. Join the other ministers in prayer and go with them to the chosen aisle.
- The cross bearer leads the procession.
- When you reach the base of the altar and you may stay in the middle or slightly left, wait until everyone arrives and is arrayed at the foot of the alter. Then, when the lector begins to put the Gospel book on the altar, and the servers are placing the candles at the altar, the cross bearer will place the cross onto the base, being sure that the cross then faces the congregation. When you have placed the cross, you return to the foot of the altar. Then you may return to your seat for Mass.
- For the recessional, go to the altar, bowing toward the altar then go up the steps, when the last song begins. Take the cross from the stand and wait with it there until Father begins to leave the altar. Then go to the base of the altar, facing the altar, awaiting Father's indication that the recession will begin. Begin to walk slowly in the direction of the exit aisle (determined by Father before Mass begins) and everyone will follow.
- After Mass, return the cross to the base on the





Patriot Day – September 11th

Three months after the September 11th, 2001, attack on the United States,

President George W. Bush signed into law a bill designating September 11th as Patriot Day.

Not to be confused with Patriots' Day, an April holiday in some New England states celebrating the first shots fired at Lexington and Concord, Patriot Day honors the nearly three thousand people who lost their lives on the morning of September 11th, 2001. Flags are flown at half-staff throughout the country, and a moment of silence is observed at 8:46AM Eastern time, the minute the first plane struck the North Tower of the World Trade Center in New York.

While Memorial Day and similar state observances honor those who have given their lives in service to their country, Patriot Day is unique in that it honors first responders as well as the many civilians who died on that day.
