

St. Francis of Assisi | Feast Day October 4

Perhaps the most famous story of St. Francis is when he tamed the wolf that was terrorizing the people of Gubbio.

Back in the early 13th century, a wolf began to stalk the countryside surrounding the town. He was hungry. He preyed on livestock. Soon, his hunger brought him closer and closer to town. He began to attack anyone who ventured outside the walls of Gubbio.

The ferocious wolf's reign of terror gripped the townspeople with fear. Eventually, it got so bad that no one would even dare step outside the walls of the city.

A friar from the neighboring town of Assisi heard about the attacks. He traveled to Gubbio to meet with the wolf.

Legend has it, the wolf rushed at the friar, teeth bared, ready to attack. The friar made the Sign of the Cross, and suddenly the wolf slowed, and became docile. He laid his head in the friar's hands.

The friar spoke to the wolf gently. He called him "Brother Wolf." He scolded the wolf for terrorizing the town and for killing so many people. Then the friar offered a deal: If the wolf promised to never again attack any person or animal, the townspeople of Gubbio would feed him and make sure he never went hungry again.

And the wolf agreed. The friar, of course, was Francis.

Legend has it the wolf lived near Gubbio for another two years. He would peaceably go from door to door, and the townspeople would feed him. It hurt no one and no one hurt it. Even the dogs did not bark at it. And



when the wolf died of old age, the towns people mourned him. The wolf's peaceful ways had been a living reminder to them of the wonders, patience, virtues and holiness of St. Francis. It had been a living symbol of the power and providence of the living God.


Life Chain: Today – October 6

From Harm

From the Earth Ministry: Harmful Chlormequat in Oat-based C



"Dirty Dozen" and "Clean 15" fruits and vegetables as per analysis by the Environmental Working Group (EWG). Recently, the EWG has performed testing that shows disturbing levels of the harmful chemical Chlormequat in some cereals, most prevalent in several Quaker Oats and some Cheerios brands. Chlormequat has been linked to a variety of fetal growth and health problems in animals, suggesting strong likelihood for harm to humans and particularly to children.

Chlormequat is applied to oats while approaching maturity, to keep the stalks from bending over so that they are easier to harvest. Prior to 2020, Chlormequat was banned in oats and other grains grown in the US, while remaining unregulated in many other countries. Currently the chemical is allowed only in trace amounts in foods by the EPA and FDA. Because cereal makers import some foreigngrown oats (hard to believe given what we see in fields around the Midwest), the amount of Chlormequat found in oat-based cereals can exceed the rigid EPA standard.

You can avoid Chlormequat contamination by purchasing cereals that are made from grains grown organically. That's the same suggestion offered previously for mitigating contamination when you purchase "Dirty Dozen" fruits and vegetables (go to https://www.ewg.org/foodnews for a listing).

Eucharistic From Communion to Community to Commission: Year 3 of the Eucharistic Revival In today's gospel we hear some rather astounding words. John, apparently speaking for the

apostles who were traveling with Jesus, said:

"Teacher, we saw someone driving out demons in your name and we tried to prevent him because he does not follow us." Jesus replied: "Do not prevent him. There is no one who performs a mighty deed in my name who can at the same time speak ill of me. For whoever is not against us is for us." (Mark 9:38-39)

Jesus' message was clear: It is not a small group of people who hold special privilege and are given the commission to share the message of Jesus. We are all called to do this.

Year 3 of the Eucharistic Revival is a year of action. During Emmaus 90 weekly formation sessions, each presenter was asked: "What does a Eucharistic Missionary look like?" Bishop Jeffrey Haines answered with a quote from Henri Nouen's book With Burning Hearts.

The Eucharist has freed us from our paralyzed sense of loss within us and empowers us to go out into the world and to bring good news to the poor, sight to the blind, liberty to captives, and to proclaim again that God has shown His face to all people. But we are not alone – we are sent out with our brothers and sisters who also know that Jesus lives within them. The movement from the Eucharist is the movement from **communion** to **community** to **ministry**.

So ... when we are sent out into the world after each mass to carry on the mission of Jesus, we have this reassurance:

<u>We are not alone</u>... Jesus is with us and lives within us <u>We are not alone</u>... we are sent out with our brothers and sisters who also know that Jesus lives within them

The Eucharistic Revival is not a time-specific event ... and we are caught up in the movement from Communion to Community to Commission. After the final blessing the priest says: "The Mass is ended, go in peace to love and serve the Lord." We respond: Thanks be to God.


October is World Mission Month
