



A Catholic Perspective on Praying for the Departed

As the weather grows colder and the leaves fall, and Thanksgiving and Christmas approach, it is natural that our thoughts turn to those whom we have loved who are no longer with us.

How appropriate, then, that the Catholic Church offers us November, which begins with All Saints Day and All Souls Day, as the Month of the Holy Souls in Purgatory.

In recent years, perhaps no Catholic doctrine has been more misunderstood by Catholics themselves than the doctrine of Purgatory. Consequently, we tend to downplay it, even seem a little embarrassed by it, and it is the Holy Souls who suffer because of our discomfort with the doctrine.

Purgatory is not, as many people think, one last trial; all of those who make it to Purgatory will one day be in Heaven. Purgatory is where those who have died in grace, but who have not fully atoned for the *temporal punishments* resulting from their sins, go to finish their atonement before entering Heaven. A soul in Purgatory may suffer, but he has the assurance that he will ultimately enter Heaven when his punishment is complete. Catholics believe Purgatory is an expression of God's love, His desire to cleanse our souls of all that might keep us from experiencing the fullness of joy in Heaven.

As Christians, we don't travel through this world alone. Our salvation is wrapped up with the salvation of others, and charity requires us to come to their aid. The same is true of the Holy Souls. In their time in Purgatory, they can pray for us, and we should pray for the faithful departed that they may be freed from the punishment for their sins and enter into Heaven.

We should pray for the dead throughout the year, especially on the anniversary of their death, but in this Month of the Holy Souls, we should devote some time every day to prayer for the dead. We should start with those closest to us—our mother and father, for instance—but we should also offer prayers for all the souls, and especially for those most forsaken.

We believe that those Holy Souls for whom we pray will continue to pray for us after they have been released from Purgatory. If we live Christian lives, we too will likely find ourselves in Purgatory someday, and our acts of charity toward the Holy Souls there now will ensure that they remember us before the throne of God when we are most in need of prayers. It's a comforting thought, and one that should encourage us, especially in this month of November, to offer our prayers for the Holy Souls.

From the Earth Ministry: Hope for Unlimited Clean Energy in Our Time?

Our Time? Scientists have been laboring for decades to create a controlled nuclear FUSION reaction. Fusion is the type of energy that powers the sun and stars. Until now, nuclear power has come from FISSION reactors. Fission reactors create energy by splitting atoms. Fusion reactors would create energy by joining atoms together. Fusion reactors would generate contamination-free energy without the radioactive waste of fission reactors. A recent *CBS 60 Minutes* exposé described the internationally-competitive race to harness nuclear fusion, especially by physicists in China and the USA.

A key step in the nuclear fusion process is to produce heated plasma, which is a gas of hot ions and free-moving electrons. For the first time, a fusion device at UW Madison has generated this plasma via a sophisticated magnetic mirror which became operational on July 15, 2024.

This breakthrough provides hope that unlimited, carbon-free, radioactive-free energy may one day be reality.

From Communion to Community to Commission: Year 3 of the Eucharistic Revival

Eucharistic Revival Just before ascending into heaven, Jesus commissioned the disciples to be missionaries and bring the gospel message to others. By virtue of our baptism, that commission is handed down to us as well. Let's look once again at the words Jesus used to commission us:

All power in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age. (Matthew 29: 18-20)

The word "observe" is an interesting word here. How can we teach others to observe what Jesus commanded of his disciples. One of the ways we observe something or someone is to pay attention not only to what is said, but to what is done ... to what is observable. That is at the heart of our mission. Watch carefully, and learn from observing. What am I doing that others "observe" what Jesus commanded? Do my actions reflect Jesus in observable ways? That is faith in action. This week, let's make a deliberate effort to show Jesus to others in our actions. Let's ask ourselves, at least once, WWJD (What Would Jesus Do?)

End of Life Planning Now and at the Hour of Our Death

A PASTORAL LETTER FROM THE ROMAN CATHOLIC BISHOPS OF WISCONSIN ON END OF LIFE DECISIONS

As Bishops, we know that death is not final, for Jesus promised His followers that we will see Him face to face and share in eternal life. Yet, despite our hope in Christ, we know that dying can present great difficulties. Many decisions need to be made and we pray that you do not wait until you or a loved one is near death to reflect and prepare.
