




# **Advent Giving Results**

# What does 'AMEN' mean? Why do we end prayers with 'Amen'?

"Amen" is a Hebrew word that means "truly" or "so be it." When we say this at the end of a prayer, we are agreeing with the prayer. We're asking God to please let it be as we have prayed.

The Bible uses "amen" in both the Old and New Testaments. Almost half the occurrences appear in Deuteronomy as God announces punishments for specific sin (Deuteronomy 27:15–26). The people respond by saying "Amen" in agreement with God's justice and in acquiescence to His ways.

In the Old Testament, "amen" is linked with praise. For example, in <u>1 Chronicles</u> 16:36, "... all the people said, 'Amen!' and praised the Lord." <u>Nehemiah</u> 5:13 and 8:6 similarly link saying "amen" with praising the Lord.

In the New Testament, letters often use "amen" in connection with praises to God, including letters from John, Jude, Peter, and Paul. Here is one example: "Now to him who is able to do far more abundantly than all that we ask or think, according to the power at work within us, to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, forever and ever. Amen" (Ephesians 3:20–21).

When Christians pray and end their prayers with "Amen" they are asking that God would hear and grant their prayer. "Amen" is not a magical word nor a plea to conform God to our wills. Rather, it is a statement of confident hope that we make to a God who invites His children to come to Him in prayer (Hebrews 4:14–16; 10:19–23; Matthew 7:7–11). We trust that He knows what is best and desire that His will be done (Matthew 6:10; 26:39). When we pray according to God's will, we can be confident that He will grant our requests (John 14:12; 1 John 5:14).

## From the Earth Ministry:

**Eco-Friendly Deicing** 

In winter, we try to keep our roadways, driveways and walkways free of snow and ice.

The most plentiful and cheapest way to melt snow and ice is to use rock salt (sodium chloride) or its "cousin" compound, calcium chloride. These two chlorides damage concrete, and the runoff or spray is harmful trees, plants and animals. With the spring thaw, our lakes and streams receive concentrations that are harmful to plankton and fish. It is estimated that 2.2 billion pounds of chlorides wash into Lake Michigan annually. Finally, the two most prevalent chloride compounds are harmful to pets by irritating their paws or making them sick if they ingest them by licking their paws.

Some eco-friendly things you can do aside from purchasing commercially-made deicers, include:


**Shoveling** - The best deterrent to ice is to shovel as soon after a snowfall as possible to allow the sunshine to dry out surfaces and avoid ice build-up.

**Sand or Kitty Litter** – Provide traction and for sand, a great way to use up excess from a sandbox.

**Wood By-products** – Wood shavings and sawdust from your workshop provide traction. So does ash from last night's fire. Ash also darkens the surface, attracting heat from the sun for melting.

**Coffee grounds** – Sprinkling used grounds will help speed melting and provide some traction. This does not work very quickly, so it is best done when temperatures aren't too low and the sun is shining.

If you aren't able to use any of the above and must purchase a chloride for melting, use **Magnesium chloride**. It is available at most hardware and big box stores and is far safer for plants and animals. **Calcium magnesium acetate (CMA)** is considered the best overall choice for safely melting ice. Although more difficult to find, CMA-based products are non-toxic, and the minerals they contain can actually fertilize the plants they come into contact with. Good brands include Kind Melt, Safe Paw, Snow Joe MeltzGo and Natural Rapport Pet-Friendly Ice Melt.





#### **Fourth Sunday Formation**

Stay, watch, and learn after Mass about Catholic Identity on the fourth weekend of the month. On January 25/26, we will show a short video about the why and how of Eucharistic Adoration, followed by a brief opportunity to experience Adoration. Did you know there is at least one Eucharistic adoration time at each parish per week? See the front of the bulletin for the schedule.

#### Emmaus 90 - 2025

Emmaus 90 is a 90-day journey from New Year's to Easter 2025 that brings you closer to Jesus Christ through prayer and formation. It's a personal commitment to grow in holiness with the support of hundreds of fellow participants (pilgrims) and the leadership of nationally-recognized educators.

One of the features of Emmaus 90 are the formation sessions. This year we will again offer monthly formation sessions after the 9:00AM Mass at St. Therese Parish on the second Sunday of the month and will last about 30 minutes. **The first session is this Sunday, January 12**. What a great way to start the new year with a deeper commitment grow in holiness and knowledge of the faith.





## A Week of Prayer for Christian Unity: January 18th – 25th

"Do You Believe This?" - John 11:17-27

For the year 2025, the prayers and reflections for the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity were prepared by the brothers and sisters of the monastic

community of Bose in northern Italy. The resources are jointly published by the Dicastery for Promoting Christian Unity and the World Council of Churches, 2025 marks the 1,700th anniversary of the first Christian Ecumenical Council, held in Nicaea, near Constantinople in 325 AD. This commemoration provides a unique opportunity to reflect on and celebrate the common faith of Christians, as expressed in the creed formulated during this council. Sometimes, we "Go Out in Mission" and don't even realize it until later. In November, I and my Coffee Boys received a text that PW would not be at our Tuesday gathering as he had a brain bleed and was in ICU. Bleeding was stopped but he needed a 12 hour surgery to repair aneurisms and relieve pressure and fluid.

What started was three weeks of communication with PW's wife, and sharing that with the Coffee Boys. I sent messages to PW's wife about being strong and talking to God, and even suggesting it was fine to tell God she was angry. I copied the Coffee Boys, and thus began a Prayer Chain of sorts.

PW was a dear college friend and I began sending daily updates to about six fraternity brothers beyond the Coffee Boys. Soon we had more prayers and these folks expanded the Prayer Chain such that today, we have a large group across the Country praying for PW! Some of these folks have gotten prayers coming from friends in Church Groups that don't even know PW! We are even getting scripture readings and written out prayers sent to PW's wife, which is helping her tremendously. Many of us "tough guys" are expressing opinions about the strength of prayers and that the Lord is hearing us - never expected that when I began passing the daily updates along!

Best of all – PW is hanging in there for what will be a long journey with ups and downs. Only God knows how this ends, but all of us understand that He is hearing our prayers, and whatever the outcome, it is helping!

Who knew that a text from someone in distress would cause folks from all over the US to "Go Out in Mission" to pray for PW and his wife, even though many don't know them.
