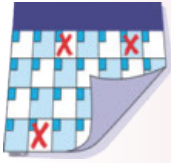

From the Earth Ministry: Wisconsin Leads the Way Again



In a previous article we informed you that Wisconsin is at the forefront of efforts to create clean energy from nuclear fusion reactors. Our State now has another Nation-leading clean energy effort underway. It involves The Columbia Energy Storage Project, which will offer 10 hours of energy storage capacity (enough to power 18,000 homes for 10 hours) by removing carbon dioxide from the atmosphere. The CO2 removed will be compressed into a liquid.

When energy is needed, the system converts the liquid into gas to power a turbine that generates electricity. The gas will be stored in what utility officials call an "Energy Dome."

This is the first project in the Nation that transforms a greenhouse gas into storage for subsequent use in producing clean energy. It is modeled after a successful prototype project in Italy. The facility will be built on grounds of the current Columbia Energy Center (close to the Wisconsin River just south of Portage). The location is near a coal-fired power plant that is scheduled for retirement in 2026. That's the same year the utility (Alliant Energy) hopes to have the Energy Dome up and running.

The smoke-belching stack visible for miles near the Wisconsin River Bridge on I-94 will not be an operating landmark much longer.

Did You Know???

Ways to Have a Meaningful Lent



1. Sacrifice:

What will I give up?

Is there something in your life that is drawing you away from God? Or do you have a behavior that is not in line with what God teaches? Lent is a good time to evaluate your life to see what you can change to make yourself a better person and draw closer to God. The goal of choosing to sacrifice for Lent is that what we chose really *is* a sacrifice on our part. Think and pray about what you can give up. Whether it is a food or a behavior, it should be something that will cause you to think of Jesus and His sacrifice whenever you make the effort to avoid it or amend your ways. Each time you do, you will think of Jesus and you can say a prayer to thank Him for His sacrifice on the cross for you

2. Growth: What will I add to my life to help me to grow spiritually?

What can I add to my life to make it better or to draw closer to God? Lent is a period of the Church year when we reflect on Jesus' passion and death for our sins and we prepare to celebrate His resurrection from the dead on Easter Sunday. It is good to add something to our lives that will help us to more fully connect in our hearts with Jesus' sacrifice for us and contemplate what that means to us. We can also reflect on how we can live our lives better in light of Jesus' sacrifice for us. Some ideas are:

- Read the Bible each day.
- Do acts of charity to others.
- Read about the saint of the day each day.
- Volunteer at your parish.
- Write a letter to God each week. Contemplate His passion and death, ask Him questions, and share your heart with Him.
- Spend time meditating on Jesus' passion and death on the cross.
- Go to Confession.
- Attend a retreat or schedule time for a retreat after Lent.
- Pray the **Rosary** more often.
- Pray the **Divine Mercy Chaplet**.
- Take part in the **Stations of the Cross**.
- Pray and spend time thinking about what you will do to add more prayer to your life to enhance your Lent experience and draw closer to God.



2025, A Jubilee Year of Hope

Every 25 years, the Church universal celebrates an "Ordinary Jubilee Year." Pope Francis, following the ancient tradition, has declared the year 2025 as a Jubilee Year of Hope according to his letter "Spes non confundit" ("Hope does not disappoint" Rom 5:5). Every Jubilee Year is a "moment of genuine, personal encounter with the Lord Jesus [...] whom the Church is charged to proclaim always, everywhere and to all as 'our hope' (1 Tim 1:1)".

In his letter on the Jubilee Year, Pope Francis defines hope as "the desire and expectation of good things to come." Jesus Christ and the gift of his pierced heart on the cross obtained for us the gift of eternal salvation, thus filling our hearts with the hope of fullness of life in this life and into eternity (see John 10:10). As Pope Francis also says, "Christian hope does not deceive or disappoint because it is grounded in the certainty that nothing and no one may ever separate us from God's love."

At five locations in the Archdiocese of Milwaukee, a crucifix is the central image of the Jubilee. This crucifix displaying the pierced heart of Jesus signifies and calls to mind the gifts of God given to His children by the merits of Jesus on the cross, the same merits that give value and efficacy to the work of the Church, including the dispensation of indulgences.

Take the time to visit one of the five pilgrimage sites designated by Archbishop Emeritus Jerome ListECKI for this holy year: Cathedral of St. John the Evangelist, Milwaukee; Basilica of St. Josaphat, Milwaukee; Archdiocesan Marian Shrine, Milwaukee;

National Shrine of Mary, Help of Christians (Holy Hill), Hubertus; and the Schoenstatt Shrine, Waukesha.

may the faith You have given us

a yearning for the treasures of heaven.
May that same grace spread
the joy and peace of our Redeemer
throughout the earth.

Adoration specifically refers to any prayer in front of the Blessed Sacrament whether in front of a closed Tabernacle or in front of the exposed host in a monstrance. The Eucharist is **the real presence of Jesus Christ** under the appearances of bread and wine, consecrated during the Mass. It is exposed during adoration to provide the faithful with the opportunity to worship and pray directly before Christ, acknowledging His true presence. Here are some ideas about how to spend your time in adoration.

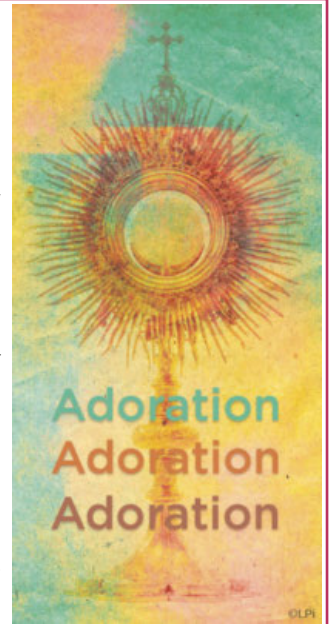
First of all, don't worry about what you are to say, simply be in the presence of Jesus. That is pretty mind-blowing stuff in and of itself.

Second, call to mind your sins or sufferings and ask Jesus to have mercy on you. Great healing is available to those who come to adoration.

Third, are you thankful for anything? Think of each person or thing in your life you are thankful for and thank Jesus for each one.

Fourth, read a little of the Sacred Scriptures and pause quietly to think in your heart what it means. The holy rosary and our Blessed Mother can be very helpful when doing this. Listen to what Jesus is saying to you. After all, He is truly present in front of you.

Lastly, I remind you of the first advice, be in the presence of Jesus and look at Him. The catechism of the Catholic Church tells the beautiful short story of St. John Vianney who was amazed that one of his parishioners would spend such long hours in front of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. He said to him, "What do you do in adoration?" The man simply responded, "I look at Him and He looks at me."



How does Eucharistic Adoration take place?

Use the laminated prayer cards to follow along with the prayers and songs during Adoration. These are found in the pews at St. Vincent Pallotti and in the chapel at St. Therese. Don't worry if you can't follow along perfectly! The practice becomes more familiar with time.

Exposition: The priest takes the consecrated host, Blessed Sacrament, from the tabernacle and places it in the monstrance on the altar as the faithful sing.

Adoration: This time may include songs, prayers, and readings to mark the time and to help direct attention to God. Silent time invites us to converse with God in our hearts.

Benediction: At the end of the Adoration period the priest extends God's blessing to us through Blessed Sacrament in the monstrance. Then the Divine Praises are proclaimed.

Reposition of the Blessed Sacrament: Blessed Sacrament is returned to the tabernacle as we again sing praise to God.

Eucharistic Adoration is offered at St. Therese in the chapel on Wednesdays at 5:30PM (followed by Mass at 6:00PM) and at St. Vincent Pallotti on Thursdays at 11:30AM (followed by Mass at Noon). Come join us!

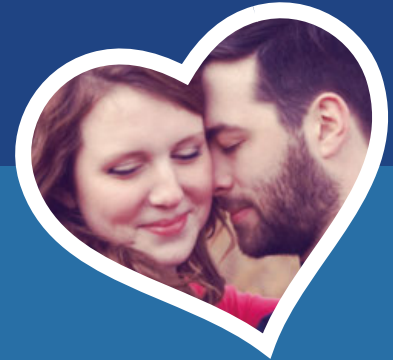
