






St Therese Reuniting Us As "...One Nation, Under God..." Prayer Service Please join us for our monthly Prayer

Service after Mass on February 16

for reuniting us as "...One Nation, Under God..." The service is about 25 minutes.

We say the Rosary and ask Blessed Mary to intervene for us with the Lord in seeking His help to reunite us as "...One Nation, Under God..." as we seem to be lost in the wilderness and have forgotten our love of God and one another. As Catholics, saying the Rosary is a great way to ask for the Lord's help. We also do a short meditation to remind us that while we are all different, we need to love one another.



How February 14 came to be celebrated as the feast for lovers is somewhat a mystery. What little is known of the feast's namesake can be attributed to the lives of two martyrs: one a priest, the other a bishop.

Their lives bear little resemblance to the contemporary holiday. The priest Valentine reportedly was beheaded in 269 by Emperor Claudius II. The bishop, known for healing, was martyred earlier. It's probable that a medieval custom of sending messages of love on this day merged later with the feast.

How can we hear from God?

The natural question is of course, "How do I go about listening so that I can hear God and know what He is saying?" If God is indeed all knowing (<u>Isaiah 40:28</u>) and cares about me (<u>Psalm 139</u>; <u>Matthew 10:29-31</u>), of course I want to know what He is saying and if He is saying anything to me personally. God knows we are asking questions and He bends low to listen and to speak to ensure we can hear Him.

The Bible tells us: "Long ago, at many times and in many ways, God spoke to our fathers by the prophets, but in these last days he has spoken to us by his Son, whom he appointed the heir of all things, through whom also he created the world" (Hebrews 1:1-2). And at Jesus' baptism "a voice from heaven said, 'This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased, listen to Him" (Matthew 3:17).

The Bible was written, under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, by men who were authorized by God to write the words of God so His people would know, without a doubt, who God is, what He does, what He wants for His people, and what He expects from us (2 Peter 1:21; John 20:31). The best and most trustworthy way to hear from God is to read His words written in the Bible. We do this when we read the Bible ourselves and also when the Bible is preached in sermons, quoted by friends who offer us counsel and wisdom, and when familiar verses from the Bible come to our minds when we pray.

There are many reasons we want to hear from God. Some of the more common motives are because we want to know that He is real, we need to know what we should and should not do, and we are afraid of making decisions because we might make the wrong one. The most important part of hearing God is to learn what He has already said and to talk to Him about it. As followers of Jesus, filled with the Holy Spirit who is our counselor, we can read the Bible and pray to God. We can join God in talking and listening. In doing this we can receive wisdom from the Holy Spirit (1 Corinthians 2:10-13), and we can know the will of the Father because He has made it possible for us to "have the mind of Christ"

(1 Corinthians 2:16)

From the Earth Ministry: Eco-Laundry Update

In 2023 we mentioned that one of our Ministry members started using "laundry sheets" as an alternative to popular liquid or powdered laundry detergent. Waste water from the most-advertised popular brands contains harmful chemicals and microfibers. Sustainable alternatives like Seventh Generation liquid detergent and other eco-brands contain none or far lesser amounts of harmful chemicals, while producing plastic-free waste water. Same goes for laundry sheets which are packaged in biodegradable or recycled paper instead of plastic.

Most recently in August, 2024, Consumer Reports found that laundry sheets were okay for routine laundry but didn't work as well as traditional detergents, especially on stains or heavily soiled materials. From their experience in using laundry sheets, our Ministry member found them just fine on stained and heavily soiled areas if sprayed in advance with a pretreatment.

The member recently switched from laundry sheets to tablets made by Blueland (www.blueland.com). They were amazed that such a small thing (about the size of two quarters on top of each other) can create clean clothes just as well as any of the products they used in the past. They also reiterated that laundry sheets and tablets are wonderful for travel – no worry about accidental leaks soaking items in your suitcase.

For more information on eco-friendly laundry alternatives check out what Good Housekeeping found in their 2024 testing at www.goodhousekeeping.com/home-products/g43355973/best-eco-friendly-laundry-detergents/. Note that even popular brands like Tide and Gain now offer more environmentally friendly variations (but they still come in plastic containers).


