

HOW TO DO PERSONAL PRAYER

<u>1) Show Up.</u> Most days, we don't pray simply because we don't quite get around to it. Perhaps the best metaphor to describe our hurried and distracted lives is that of a car wash. For most of us, that's just what our typical day does to us—it sucks us through. Prayer is truly a discipline. Show up!

2) Quiet Your Heart. Solitude is a form of awareness, a way of being present and perceptive within all of life. It's having a dimension of reflectiveness in our daily lives that brings gratitude, appreciation, peacefulness, enjoyment, and prayer. It's the sense, within ordinary life, that life is precious, sacred, and enough.

3) Look Inside. Our culture can keep us so entertained, busy, preoccupied, and distracted that we lose all focus on the deeper things. We have to know when it's time to unplug the television, turn off the phone, shut down the computer, silence the iPod, lay away the sports page, and resist going out for coffee with a friend, so that, for one moment, we're not avoiding making friends with the deepest part of us.

4) Be Honest, Vulnerable, Bold. God asks us to bring our helplessness, weaknesses, imperfections, and sin to him, to walk with him, and to never hide from him. God understands that we'll make mistakes and disappoint him and ourselves. What God asks is simply that we come home, share our lives with him, and let him help us in those ways we're powerless to help ourselves.

5) Let Go of Anxiety and Shame. Faith doesn't have you believe that you'll have no worries, or that you won't make mistakes, or that you and your loved ones won't sometimes fall victim to accident or sickness. What faith gives you is the assurance that God is good, can be trusted, won't forget you, and is solidly in charge. Faith says that God is real, God is Lord, and there's ultimately nothing to fear. We're in safe hands. Reality is gracious, forgiving, loving, redeeming, and absolutely trustworthy.

6) Listen for God's Voice and Accept God's Love. We're surrounded by many voices. How do we recognize God's voice among and within all of these others? God is the author of everything that's good, whether it bears a religious label or not. Hence, God's voice is inside many things that aren't explicitly connected to faith and religion.

Lenten Observances for Fast and Abstinence

The Catholic Church asks each member to preserve the penitential character and purpose of Lent. For this reason:



- Catholics who have celebrated their 14th birthday are bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and each Friday of Lent.
- Catholics who have celebrated their 18th birthday, in addition to abstaining from meat, should fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Hence, on those days they should eat only one full meal. Smaller quantities of food may be taken at two other meals, but no food should be consumed at other times during those days. The obligation of fasting ceases with the celebration of one's 59th birthday.

Catholics should not lightly excuse themselves from these prescribed minimal penitential practices.

From the Earth Ministry:

In several prior articles we cited the enormous environmental harm posed by plastic. One impetus for focusing on the



plastics problem was Earth Day 2024's Global Theme of "Planet vs Plastics." A few weeks ago, we mentioned that only 5% of the plastic placed in recycle containers ends up being reused. Hence the accumulation of waste plastic in our world continues unabated. In fact, it is estimated that at current rates, by the year 2050, the weight of discarded plastic in the World's oceans will exceed the weight of all the fish.

We also mentioned that tiny fragments of plastics, called "microplastics" are found in water bottles, food packaging and synthetic fabrics. Microplastics and their much smaller counterpart, "nanoplastics" accumulate when ingested by animals and humans. Autopsies of human brains conducted in 2024 found a 50% increase in the amount of brainresident plastic compared to autopsies from 2016. Scientists say that today's human brain consists of 99.5% brain matter and .5% plastic. The harmful effects of this are presently unknown, but the growing accumulation can't be good.

So here are a few things you can do to 1) keep your brain comprised as God intended, and 2) keep waste plastic from smothering our planet:

- Purchase beverages in recyclable aluminum cans, bottles or cartons.
- Avoid heating or microwaving food in plastic or styrofoam containers -- heat speeds the release of plastic particles into food.
- Choose glass, metal or ceramic storage containers instead of plastic for pantry stock and leftovers.
- Drink tap water by the glass or from reusable bottles: A 2024 study found that a single liter of bottled water can contain more than 240,000 plastic particles.
- Use cloth or paper shopping bags instead of plastic ones.
- Avoid fruits and vegetables prepackaged in plastic.
