


Cookie Sale Fundraiser. Urgent

Sharing Weekend is Next Weekend: June 8

The Sharing weekend recipient for June is The Gathering. At The Gathering we believe that access to healthy food is a right, not a privilege. It should not be subject to income, race, housing, job security, neighborhood, age, mental stability, etc. Access should be equal for all. Our work of feeding the hungry, respectfully and with dignity, is not done.

Of the 50 largest cities in the United States, Milwaukee has moved from the 13th to the 2nd poorest city with 36.7% of incomes under the Wisconsin poverty threshold of \$25,543. Where there is poverty, there is hunger, and in the United States hunger has little to do with availability and everything to do with access. Affordable, nutritious foods are often inaccessible in low income neighborhoods.

Since 1982, The Gathering has been addressing this issue of access by preparing fresh, nutritious meals for Milwaukee's hungry through multiple, neighborhood-based sites – 93,000 meals annually. The Gathering is one of the largest volunteer-based meal ministries in Wisconsin. We act directly and in collaboration with others to alleviate hunger and to address the root causes and related problems associated with hunger and poverty. Our vision is to build a community of guests, volunteers and staff united by a common goal to feed the hungry in body, mind and spirit.

Donations can be made at Mass, mailed to the Parish Office or by using the QR code to donate online. If you are writing a check, please make it out to The Gathering. We ask that all donations are given by Sunday, June 15. Thank you for your generosity.

You Might be a Missionary If....

You Join us for the Corpus Christi Procession

June 22, 2025 will be the celebration of the Feast of Corpus Christi. Corpus Christi means "The Body of Christ" and is the celebration of our belief in the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist. This year, our Parishes (St. Vincent Pallotti and St. Therese), along with the Syro-Malabar Community, will be having a traditional Procession of the Eucharist following 9:00AM Mass at St Vincent Pallotti along Bluemound Road to St Therese where there will be Adoration time and Benediction. Following this there will be a lunch for all participants.

So what does this have to do with me?

We are asking all parishioners to join in this Procession. You can walk the entire distance, or participate by walking shorter distances. Process from the Church to your car. Meet the Procession at 95th and Bluemound and walk with us to St Therese Church. Join us for a block or two along the Bluemound route. The important thing is that you participate in this opportunity to outwardly demonstrate our belief, and the truth, that Christ is present in the Eucharist! The procession tradition has its roots in the 12th and 13th centuries. Pope Urban IV established Corpus Christi as a Feast Day in 1264.

So how does participating in this Procession make me a Missionary?

The Procession is a demonstration of a desire to express our belief, and the truth, that Christ is truly present in the Eucharist. By doing the Procession, we are demonstrating to others this belief, and we are demonstrating what our Catholic faith has to offer to others. We also have the opportunity to invite a family member, a friend, a neighbor or others to join us in this celebration.

Asking others to join us is a simple act, but for many of us, this is an act we are not very comfortable with. To assist, there will be flyers available in with the bulletin in the back of church or if you contact either Parish Office. If you are too uncomfortable with asking people to join us, consider distributing some of the flyers to public places that allow posting of such things. (Think grocery store bulletin boards, etc.)

From the Earth Ministry: Shopping Guide for "Dirty" and "Clean"



The USDA and FDA annually test 35,200 samples for traces of toxic residue, taken from the 47 most popular fruits and vegetables. They found that around 70% of the **non-organic**, conventionally- produced samples sold in the US contain residue from potentially harmful chemicals and pesticides.

The worst of these comprise the "Dirty Dozen," whereas the best comprise the "Clean Fifteen." The listings below are for samples taken in 2024.

The Dirty Dozen (listed from most residue to least) were found to be: 1 Strawberries; 2 Spinach; 3 Kale, and collard and mustard greens; 4 Grapes; 5 Peaches; 6 Pears; 7 Nectarines; 8 Apples; 9 Bell and hot peppers; 10 Cherries; 11 Blueberries; 12 Green beans.

The Clean Fifteen (listed from none or minimal residue to only a little) are: 1 Avocados; 2 Sweet corn; 3 Pineapple; 4 Onions; 5 Papaya; 6 Sweet peas (Frozen); 7 Asparagus; 8 Honeydew melon; 9 Kiwi; 10 Cabbage; 11 Mushrooms; 12 Mangoes; 13 Sweet potatoes; 14 Watermelon; 15 Carrots.

Our Earth Ministry encourages you to take these lists with you while grocery shopping, and to buy **organic whenever you can**. As we enter "peak season," most of the produce locally grown at farmer's markets likely qualify as organic. You can always ask the growers to make sure. Regardless, remember to wash ALL produce when you come home from the market or store!

God's Work




Our Hands

"And God said: Let there be lights made in the firmament of heaven, to divide the day and the night, and let them be signs, and for seasons, and for days and years" Gen 1: 14

Our minutes, hours ,days, weeks, months, and years are God's work for and within us. We pray because our faith requires a response of our time in prayer. Whether our hands are folded, upraised, clasped, holding a prayer, hymnal, or someone, they are signs of prayer.

Using God's work of creating you and your time on earth, increase your Stewardship of Prayer Time.
