

17th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Luke 11:1-13

Once I went to a hospice facility to celebrate Last Rites for an elderly dying man. His family had told me that he had been uncommunicative for days. At the conclusion of the ritual, we began to recite the Our Father prayer. To everyone's surprise, his lips moved, clearly mouthing the words to the Lord's prayer. Stripped of most of his faculties, the man could still pray those precious God-given petitions. A lifetime of prayer had planted the words even deeper than his failing consciousness.

Do we want the Lord's prayer to be as deeply embedded in us? If we want to be people of hope, we should. Recall that our Lord immediately follows the prayer by saying: "Ask, and it will be given to you; search, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened to you" (*Luke 11:9*). We only ask, search and knock because we hope that the request is not in vain. Everything we could possibly hope for is contained in the prayer. Praying the Our Father deepens our hope.

We should consciously pour all our hopes into the Lord's prayer; we should allow it to be an expression of hope, not simply rote words. Then, over time, it builds up our hope in God. It sinks deep into our souls and bodies. How blessed we are when these words of hope are on our lips, even when everything else seems to fail. — *Father John Muir* ©LPi





Devotions, Explained!

Daily Examen

The daily examen is a spiritual practice derived from the writings of St. Ignatius of Loyola, the founder of the Society of Jesus. A Basque nobleman, Ignatius underwent a series of religious conversions as a young man following a wound sustained in the Battle of Pamplona in 1521. His Spiritual Exercises were first published in 1548 and form the basis of what is known today as “Ignatian spirituality.”



Many different versions of the examen have been developed over the centuries, but all are centered on the same five elements which themselves reflect Ignatius’ process of self-review and spiritual discernment.

In completing the daily examen, an individual places himself in the presence of God, prayerfully reflecting on the blessings of the day, the actions he took, and the invitation God has for his future decisions.

From The Earth Ministry:

Balloons can be Dangerous

Balloons are seen as fun and harmless, but can have deadly



consequences for wildlife. A released latex balloon can rise high enough in the air that it bursts into pieces and falls back to land. If it doesn’t get very high and falls back to earth still partly inflated, it can be mistaken for food by turtles or sea birds. The bits of latex get stuck in their guts and cause starvation. The strings tie up or strangle animals.

Foil (aka Mylar) balloons are a synthetic plastic with a metallic coating and never biodegrade. They can land on power lines and cause outages. The strings can entangle animals, causing pain and starvation. In all cases, they contribute to garbage pollution.

Intentional balloon releases for celebrations are the most egregious offenders. Tens, hundreds, or thousands of balloons make an impressive display, and then they begin their damage. We can stop balloon releases for our private celebrations and discourage them in public celebrations. If we wish to do more, we can join the volunteer organizations that are picking up debris and recording the locations and amount of balloon specific debris. This improves the current situation (garbage pickup) and gives data to direct further efforts to solve this problem.

Standing Committee Monthly Reports

Parish Pastoral Council

The Combined Parish Council did not meet in July, but we did coordinate a meeting with the Archdiocese, the Parishes Trustees and Council Representatives to determine what the next steps were in our Collaboration efforts between the two Parishes. The Combined Parish Council meeting in August will be our first meeting of the new Fiscal Year and we will have Officer Elections and update Council on our meeting with the Archdiocese. We will also continue our discussion of the book "Why They Follow" by Mathew Warner. (Note - this would be a good book to read for all Parishioners interested in how to improve our Parishes.)



St. Alphonsus Liguori | August 1

Saint Alphonsus was born into a well-respected family in 1696, in Marianella, in the Kingdom of Naples. He received an exceptional education through private tutors and was conferred degrees in civil and canon law at 16. He practiced law for 8 years before he turned to the Church. He was ordained a priest in 1726.

Saint Alphonsus traveled for 26 years in the Kingdom of Naples preaching. His style of ministry was called "mission among the people," he and a group of priests or lay brothers would go to rural areas, staying for a time to teach, preach, and pray with the people there.

Saint Alphonsus was a brilliant preacher, he was able to connect with ordinary people and his teaching and sermons were marked by his compassion. In a time of restrictive Church rule, where fear of God was truly fear, Saint Alphonsus taught about God's redeeming love. He also had a special devotion to Mary, praying to her for intercession and including devotions to her in his teaching. He wrote extensively, more than 100 books which have been through thousands of editions. His books are still available today and have been translated into more than 60 languages.

In 1762 Saint Alphonsus was made a bishop by Pope Clement XIII, however, he was eventually allowed to resign his post because of his ill health. He was paralyzed for a time from rheumatic fever in 1775, and had rheumatism so severe it was deforming, bending his head so far forward that his chin rested on his chest.

He died peacefully at the age of 90 in 1787. He was canonized in 1839 by Pope Gregory XVI, and in 1871 he was named a doctor of the church by Pope Pius IX. In 1950 he was declared patron of moral theologians by Pope Pius XII.

World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly – July 27



Today we celebrate the Fifth Annual World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly. Pope Francis established this celebration on the

fourth Sunday of July, near the liturgical memorial of Saints Joachim and Anne, the grandparents of Jesus.

This year's theme is "Blessed are those who have not lost hope" (Sir 14:2).

These words, taken from the Book of Sirach, express the blessedness of the elderly and indicate hope placed in the Lord as the way to a Christian and reconciled old age.

Pope Francis said he instituted the World Day of Grandparents and the Elderly because "grandparents are often forgotten, and we forget this wealth of preserving roots and passing on" what the elderly have received. He emphasized the importance of grandparents and grandchildren getting to know one another, because "as the prophet Joel says, grandparents seeing their grandchildren dream," while "young people, drawing strength from their grandparents, will go forward and prophesy."

Mission Weekend is This Weekend: July 26/27

The Pallottine Fathers and Brothers is an international missionary religious order having communities on all of the continents. Currently its members are more than two thousand. Together with lay people, we try to spread faith in the areas of the world where the people are poor and underprivileged. Our mission appeal is for the support of mission activities of the Nagpur Province (India). The missionaries of this Province are engaged in the missions of North East India, the areas bordering China and in Zambia (Africa).

In India, the mission is centered in the hill region of Arunachal Pradesh, Nagaland and Meghalaya. It is a very new mission needing much support. New Christian communities are formed. New places of worship, educational institutions, and medical clinics are constructed. Boarding schools and self-employment projects are also necessary. We have dozens of missionary priests, along with religious sisters, engaged in missionary activities. It is a fast-growing mission. We also have new vocations from here and need to create seminaries and houses of formation. Your support through the Mission Cooperation Plan and in other ways will help us immensely to carry on and increase our engagement in the missions.

We also have African Missions. Our missionaries are actively involved in many parts of that continent – South Africa, Tanzania, Kenya, Rwanda, Congo, Nigeria, Ivory Coast, Cameroon, Malawi, Mozambique, Zambia, and all the way to Uganda.

We are making an appeal very specially this year for India and Zambia. Our support will go toward building up basic Christian communities, chapels and churches, schools and boardings, medical clinics, self-employment projects, promoting vocations and formation houses and creating better living standards for the people.

PALLOTTINE MISSION, ZAMBIA

Zambia is commonly regarded as one of the most beautiful, friendly, and diverse countries on the African continent. It's a land-locked country of rugged terrain and diverse wildlife, with many parks and safari areas. Its famous Victorian Water Falls are one of the Seven Natural Wonders, and the world's largest waterfall offers a breath-taking view too spectacular and majestic to describe! Zambia's also a Christian country, where one can encounter almost all Christian denominations. 2017 marked 125 years of the presence of Christianity.

ABOUT INDIA'S PRABHU PRAKASH PROVINCE, GUARDIAN OF THE ZAMBIAN MISSION
Nagpur, located in India's direct center, is the home base of India's Prabhu Prakash (Epiphany of the Lord) Province; the fruit of the tiny seed planted by the German Pallottine Missionaries in 1951. 50 years later, at the time of its Golden Jubilee in 2001, it had produced 300 fruits, and was preparing to branch out into two more provinces in 2002. These Provinces transformed yet again in 2019, expanding due to great growth. During the Golden Jubilee Celebration, a challenge was proposed to take up a mission in Africa. Through Divine Providence and international collaboration amongst confederates from Germany, Ireland, South Africa, and Tanzania, positive deliberations ensued, and the mission commenced.




St. Vincent Pallotti School Westwood, Lusaka



God only asks that we begin! On the first day of new year in 2015, 2 students and 1 teacher joined together in a farmhouse living room. By 2016, that number increased to 109, propelling the breaking of ground for the construction of a new school house in July 2017. Just 13 months later, on October 19 2018, St. Vincent Pallotti Catholic School was officially blessed and inaugurated.

Today, 300 children - grades 1 through 5 - are educationally engaged to know that a better world is possible, if we are committed fraternally and academically for the common good.

To ensure health and personal safety, two school buses pick-up and drop-off the students before and after lessons, and a nutritious lunch is distributed mid-day. With its formative role in shaping the local community, there are tentative plans to take the school up to grade 12.

12 vibrant and active priests are involved in various apostolates.


